

Budget 2026: Key Announcements for Family Carers

Social Protection

- €2bn increase in spending for the Department of Social Protection, bringing total budget to €28.9bn in 2026.
- Increase in the Carer's Allowance income disregard from €625 to €1,000 (single carers) and from €1,250 to €2,000 for couples (July 2026).
- Weekly social welfare payments including Carer's Allowance and Carer's Benefit will increase by €10 with proportionate increase to Half Rate Carer's Allowance and Increase for Qualified Adult payments (January 2026).
- DCA will increase by €20 to €380 per month (January 2026).
- Christmas bonus double payment (early December 2025).
- Weekly Fuel Allowance rate will go up by €5 per week to €38 (January 2026).
- Child Support Payments will increase by €8 for children under 12 (up to €58) and €16 for those aged 12 and over (up to €78 per week).
- Eligibility for Fuel Allowance has been extended to those receiving Working Family Payment (March 2026 with payments backdated to January).
- Income thresholds for the Working Family Payment increased by €60 (January 2026).
- The Back-to-School Clothing and Footwear Allowance has been extended to 2 and 3-year-olds subject to means test (June 2026).

Health & Disability

- Total funding for health is €27.4bn, an increase of €1.5bn on 2025.
- Funding for **3,370 new hires** across the health sector 300 more staff for mental health; 100 more clinicians for mental health crisis teams.
- 220 acute hospital beds, 280 community beds, 1.7 million more home support hours and 500 more nursing home places.
- €3.8bn for disability services.
- 250 new residential care placements and day service supports for 1,400 young people finishing school, and 50 places for older adults.
- Funding for **6,500 private Assessments of Need.**
- 150,000 hours of home support, 10,000 overnight and 15,000 day respite sessions for people with a disability.
- A new dedicated unit has been established in the Dept of Children, Disability and Equality to lead a full review of Ireland's disability service model. This unit will work hand-in-hand with disabled people, their families, and representative organisations to shape a long-term vision for services to 2030.



Carers in Paid Employment

- The national minimum wage will increase by 65 cents to €14.15 per hour from 1 January 2026.
- The ceiling for the 2% Universal Social Charge (USC) band will increase by €1,318 to €28,700 in line with the 65 cent per hour increase in the national minimum wage from 1 January 2026.
- The **reduced rate of USC for medical card holders is being extended until 31 December 2027**. Reduced rates of USC apply to people who have a full medical card whose income is €60,000 or less a year.
- Pension Auto Enrollment from January 2026.

Special Education

- Department of Education and Youth will receive a total €13.1bn in 2026.
- **1,717 additional SNAs** for students with Special Educational Needs in 2026 the highest number of SNAs we have ever had in our education system at almost 24,900.
- an increase of **1,042 teacher posts, including 860 additional teachers working across various Special Educational Needs** settings including in mainstream, special classes, special schools.
- New Education Therapy Service to roll out therapy supports directly into special schools.

Housing

- Total of **€11.3bn** in funding to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.
- Extension of the **Rent Tax Credit by 3 years** until the end of 2028.
- Extension of the Mortgage Interest Relief for a further 2 years.
- Extension of the **9 per cent rate of VAT on gas and electricity** bills until the 31st of December 2030.
- €130m for housing adaptation for older people and people with a disability.
- €2bn for **social home building and acquisitions**, €1.2bn for starter homes schemes including the extension of Help to Buy.

Transport

- €4.7bn for the Department of Transport.
- Including spending on DART+, Bus Connects and major road, greenway and active travel projects.
- Reduced **public transport fares** will be maintained for next year.
- €5,000 VRT relief for EVs extended to end 2026.
